VI. Reading comprehension (60 Marks)

For hundreds of years, the finest pearls in the world were found in the waters of the Arabian Gulf. The ancient pearling industry provided the only real income for the people of what is now Kuwait. The land was too barren to allow any farming. People were too concerned with finding water and food. A few families would leave the nomadic desert lifestyle and settle on the coast to fish. Some of the fishermen probably found the occasional pearl in the shallows, and kept it until there was an opportunity to barter it.

In response to the increased demand for pearls, many more families settled **permanently** in the coastal villages. **Others** would live on the coast during the four months of the pearling season, from May to September, and return to the desert in the winter. If one of the divers was lucky enough to find a top quality pearl or two, he would become very rich. There is evidence of a pearl being sold for fifteen thousand pounds (sterling) during the 1920s - equals more than three hundred thousand pounds today.

The pearl diver used to wear a wrap-around skirt or a black suit and a clip like a clothes-peg to close his nostrils. He also used a leather covering to protect his fingers and enable him to wrench the shells from the rocks underneath the sea. Each of his big toes was guarded by a similar covering. Round his neck was slung a string bag, which he filled with shells. He was attached to a rope with which the puller drew him up again when he gave the signal. Divers remained below the surface for nearly a minute and a half, and they **descended** about 30 times a day, often to a depth of 14 *fathoms. The shells were heaped on deck during the day and opened in the evening. The shells were thrown back into the sea. The divers believed that oysters would feed upon the empty shells.

The pearl industry in Kuwait began to decline in the early 1920s. That was because of the successful pearl cultivation in Japan and the world economic disaster in 1930. With the discovery of oil in 1938, pearl divers found alternative work in the growing oil industry. This resulted in the virtual death of the ancient pearl industry for the lack of divers to keep the industry going.
