My mum and dad married in 1978 and I was born on 12 August 1980, in Manchester in England. My dad was 30 years old and my mum was 27. We lived near the Manchester United football club. My dad began work when he was 16 at a newspaper. He worked from 8 o'clock in the morning until 7 o'clock in the evening and he earned £20 a week. It was a lot of money then. He made the tea when he began and now he's an important journalist. My mum was a doctor, but she was at home with my brother and me for five years!

Of course, 1980 was important for different things! A British aeroplane crashed in Tenerife, Spain and about 150 people died. And about 2,000 people died in America because it was a very, very hot summer. The American TV Company CNN made its first news broadcast and in November, Ronald Reagan won the US presidential elections for the first time. Lots of people liked an American TV programme called *Dallas*. It became very popular and millions of people watched it all over the world.

In sport, Russia won 80 gold medals at the Olympics because the United States Olympic team didn't go to the Olympic games in Moscow. And in the European Football Final, Germany became champions of Europe for the second time. They won 2-1 against Belgium. And in March 1980, Jesse Owens died at the age of 66. Owens won four gold medals at the Olympic games in Berlin in 1936.

A company called Intel made the Ethernet, the first technology to connect computers in an office. In space, the *Voyager* space rocket flew near Saturn and took photographs. It was another step in man's exploration of space. And it was the year that a computer company sold *Pac-Man* for the first time, a computer game that was very popular in 1980 and is still popular now.
